The Bethalto CUSD #8 Board of Education seeks a modification of Section 5/10-20.12(a) which would permit the District proposed waiver application to allow non-resident students whose parents are full-time employees of the Bethalto CUSD #8 to attend its schools free of charge. The Board of Education reserves the right to admit non-resident children of full-time employees when it can be done without prejudice to the rights of resident pupils. In lieu of per capita tuition the District seeks to count students for purposes of enrollment in order to maintain compliance with evidence-based funding.

The purpose of the request is to recruit and retain staff which can facilitate improved student performance by increasing overall job performance of employees. An employee's vested interests in the instructional program would become of personal benefit as well. The employee's child/children would be advantaged by the merits of their individual efforts. The benefits of a conscientious employee's contribution to an educational institution is undoubtedly enhanced and highlighted when his or her family members are impacted directly. With this waiver, full-time working parents who are employees of the District would be afforded a common purpose by coupling their professional and personal lives and becoming personally invested in the school community.

Because of the challenges Bethalto CUSD #8 is facing with recruitment and retention of staff, we see the waiver as an opportunity to add additional students to our stagnant enrollment while providing our staff an additional benefit. Often times, the most qualified candidates for positions do not always live within the District's boundaries thereby forcing the logistical separation of families of those hired due to residency issues. Some examples of this are childcare constraints, longer commutes to and from work, as well as a desire to be a part of your work community but feeling tied to your home district community, specifically in the area of extracurricular activities outside the school day. Granting this request would assist the District in recruiting high quality staff by improving the attractiveness of those employment opportunities within the District for non-resident applicants and increasing the pool of highly qualified candidates.

If approved, the impact of this opportunity will be assessed over the five-year period of the waiver through analysis of data and feedback from students, parents, faculty, and residents of the school community as an integral part of the comprehensive school improvement process. In this way, the District would monitor the impact and result of its implementation. Bethalto CUSD #8 expects that with the utilization of this waiver, to assist with recruitment and retainment of staff, could directly impact overall job performance and increase student achievement data.

Superintendent Dr. Jill Griffin presented information regarding the non-resident tuition waiver. She spoke about the number of students of staff members that would be able to attend school in our district if this modification is made. Dr. Griffin shared which area school districts are already granting waivers. She explained the process of modifying school code to those in attendance:

- 1. Posting the hearing notice on the district website
- 2. Publish hearing notice in a local newspaper
- 3. Provide notice to our local bargaining units
- 4. Provide notice to our legislators
- 5. Take an accurate account of the hearing at tonight's meeting.

If the Board of Education approves the application, the Superintendent will submit the application packet within 15 days and then it will go to the assembly in the late Winter Session.

Dr. Griffin outlined the benefits to our school district:

- It would help in recruiting/retaining staff
 - Dr. Griffin explained the district's staff shortages in the last few years (teachers, admin, bus drivers)
 - We would require anyone that is a full-time employee to participate
- Having the waiver would aide in creating a sense of investment in the work they are doing
- She pointed out that some districts are imposing a waiver to address declining enrollment. Dr. Griffin suggested the waiver could give a boost to our enrollment numbers.

The district staff was surveyed to see who would be interested in the potential waiver of tuition. It was important for our Board to know that the students are dispersed across multiple grade levels and schools and that it shouldn't impact class sizes.
